WILLISTOWN TOWNSHIP REMEMBERS BELOVED RESIDENT AND STAFF MEMBER, RITA REVES

Willistown Township Board of Supervisors, staff, and police remember longtime resident and employee, Rita Reves. Rita passed away peacefully on September 28, 2023, at the age of 96.



No Willistown resident can boast a record of service to the Township as lengthy and comprehensive as Rita Reves. A resident of Willistown since 1960, Rita served the Township in nearly every capacity—as an elected official, a volunteer, and as a member of the Township staff. In 1980, Rita was the first woman elected to the Board of Supervisors, where she served for 12 years. In 1994, Rita joined the Township staff where she worked in the Planning Department until 2020. Rita also served as a volunteer member of the Willistown Planning Commission for 23 years, and was chairwoman for 22. In 2017, Garrett Mill Park was renamed the Rita Reves Park in her honor.

In the fall of 2023, Rita Reves Park was renamed to the Rita Reves Memorial Park. The 20.9-acre park located at 1040 Garrett Mill Road, Newtown Square offers a picnic pavilion with restrooms, a playground, 2 baseball fields, and 1 soccer/lacrosse field. The park is a symbol of Rita's devotion and countless hours of service to the development of Willistown Township, shaping it into a community known for its conserved open spaces.

NATURE RAMBLE AT OKEHOCKING PRESERVE • Wednesday, May 1, 10:30am–12:00pm

Join naturalist Lon Myers for an entertaining general nature walk to explore the plants, animals, and geologic history of Okehocking Preserve. Lon will share some tips about beginning birding, edible and medicinal plants, and unseen denizens of the preserve. If it is a clear day, Lon will have a spotting scope to observe sunspot activity. Zach's talk will explore the initial Quaker settlers of Willistown, their communities, and the impact their presence had on the local native population by looking at the experience of the Okehocking people in Willistown.

Here is an opportunity to dispose of sensitive documents that you've been storing but have been reluctant to dispose of as trash. Cancelled checks, new checks that you'll never use, insurance statements, tax forms, charge/bank/debit statements, receipts, confidential letters, and brokerage statements are some of the many types of sensitive documents that people need to dispose of with finality in this age of identity theft. Shredding will take place on site in a specially equipped truck.

LIMIT: Six boxes or paper bags preferred, please place items in the trunk or rear of your vehicle for easier unloading. DO NOT bring newspapers, magazines, cardboard, wallpaper, books, sheets of plastic, or three-ring binders. Remove all binder clips. Items containing staples, standard paper clips, or rubber bands will be accepted.

The Environmental Sustainability Commission has organized its annual one-day, no-charge, drop-off E-Waste recycling program for their residents.



Please note due to a change in vendors we are only taking E-Waste: Computers, monitors, tablets, cellphones, printers, laptops, servers, keyboards, computer mice, fax machines, typewriters, small appliances, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, dorm fridges, microwaves, telephones, cameras, calculators, and TVs including tube and projection TVs. *Please place items in the trunk or rear of your vehicle for easier unloading.*

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: Large appliances such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, mattresses, oil tanks, upholstered furniture, tires, metal, and household hazardous waste.

WILLISTOWN RECOGNIZES THE 2023 COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD WINNER, BART VAN VALKENBURGH

The Willistown Township Community Service Award recognizes a resident who gives their time to the community by serving on a Township board or commission.

Bart Van Valkenburgh was honored as the recipient of the 2023 Willistown Township Community Service Award at the December 2023 Board of Supervisors meeting. Bart and his wife Denise have lived in the Greentree neighborhood of Willistown for 43 years. Being particularly well-versed in the history of this area, Bart has offered presentations on this topic to both the Willistown Parks & Recreation Department and the Willistown Historical Commission.



A self-proclaimed "history enthusiast," Bart was appointed to the Willistown Township Historical Commission in 2019 and served as chair during 2023. In 2020, he was appointed as a Willistown representative to the Bartram Bridge Joint Preservation Board. As a member of these boards, Bart has offered his extensive knowledge to the community and has spearheaded several preservation initiatives. Bart also lends his passion for and knowledge of history to the wider community. He serves as a board member for the Paoli Battlefield Preservation Fund. Bart is Vice Chair of the Tredyffrin Easttown Historic Society where he has shared his extensive collection of matchbooks to present a fascinating glimpse into Main Line history. Bart's interactive programs engage his audience as he weaves stories and memories that more than scratch the surface of Main Line history.

In 2022, Bart coordinated and led a Willistown history tour as a part of the Chester County "Town Tours & Village Walks" program. Participants enjoyed touring Whitehorse Village, Okehocking Preserve, Historic Sugartown, and the circa 1860 Bartram Covered Bridge.

For many years, Bart has dedicated his time to public service both in Chester County and here in Willistown Township. He is our go-to person when the Township has questions on local history. Thank you, Bart, for lending your expertise to Willistown Township and beyond!

WILLISTOWN POLICE TIPS AND REMINDERS FOR YOUR SPRING SEASON

HOME SECURITY

As you start spring cleaning and yard work, remember to secure your home by locking doors and windows, especially when you're away. Consider installing outdoor lighting and surveillance cameras to deter potential burglars.



VEHICLE SAFETY

With the changing weather, ensure your vehicle is in good condition by checking tire pressure, brakes, and windshield wipers. Also, be mindful of pedestrians, cyclists, and increased traffic on the roads.



CHILD SAFETY

With children spending more time outdoors, teach them about stranger danger, road safety, and the importance of wearing helmets when biking or skating. Supervise young children closely near water bodies and playgrounds.

ECOCENTRIC LECTURE SERIES: OTTERS IN OUR WATERS

The story of the resurgence of the North American river otter (*Lontra canadensis*) is one of the great success stories of modern wildlife conservation. Prior to 1900, degradation of water quality and habitat, human encroachment, and unregulated hunting led to an estimated 75 percent decline in North American otter populations. Today, Pennsylvania enjoys healthy populations of the elusive otter in almost every major river system, thanks to focused reintroduction efforts and improved water quality. In this lecture we will explore otter populations, conservation, and their vital role in nature with Director of Watershed Protection Program, Lauren McGrath.


