WILLISTOWN CODE CORNER

Uber Eats Couldn't Find My House!

"Take a left after the corn field, and then we're six houses down on the right. If you pass the yard with the two dogs, you've gone too far." Hmm... that sounds confusing. Solution? Clear and visible house numbers! Did you know Willistown Township has an Ordinance specific to street address numbers? That's right! Chapter 117 is dedicated street address numbers for the properties in Willistown.

Here's what the Code requires for visibility. Make sure the numbers are...

- large enough to see from a distance (3" minimum in height);
- displayed with the background contrasting, spacing, arrangement, and font in a legible manner; and
- positioned in a way such that there are no obstructions to prevent visibility from the roadway.

Following these regulations will help when your friends are coming over for a cocktail party and for those shopping and food deliveries. But the other, and more important, reason is for your safety. The Township must ensure that your property will be easy to locate during any kind of an emergency. Plus, you won't have to use irregular landmarks, like dogs, to give someone directions. Share a driveway or a bank of mailboxes? If you have more than one mailbox at the end of your driveway, please also post the appropriate street address on the front façade of the building so that there won't be any confusion once someone has come up the driveway. **And one more reminder:** don't post these addresses on trees or utility poles.

RECYCLE RIGHT IN WILLISTOWN!

Did you know by the Township Code, all Township residents are required to separate recyclable materials from waste generated on their properties? All it takes is a few minutes a day to rinse, sort, and place the recyclables curbside for your weekly trash and recycling pickup. This simple habit has a big impact right here in Willistown! At the end of every year, your trash and recycling hauler must file an annual PA Act 101 report listing residential and commercial recycling tonnage for the year. The Willistown Township Environmental Sustainability Committee uses the reported tonnage to apply for a grant from the PA Department of Environmental Protection. Every year, Willistown puts the grant money towards offering residents free recycling events such as e-waste recycling, wood chipping, and paper shredding.

So, keep on recycling right, Willistown, and keep these tips in mind when it's time to put recyclables curbside:

- **Paper:** Newspaper, cardboard (broken down), office paper, magazines, junk mail, food boxes, rinsed juice and milk cartons, and paperback books. Remember no dirty take-out containers or pizza boxes!
- **Metal and Glass:** Clean, empty aerosol and non-aerosol containers, aluminum beverage and food containers, including pie pans and trays. Clean, empty clear or green and brown glass bottles and jars. Labels and lids may be left on.
- **Plastic:** Well-rinsed containers marked #1-#5 and #7. Labels and lids may be left on. Remember #6 or Styrofoam is NOT recyclable curbside.
- **Yard waste:** Leaves and branches are picked up curbside on days designated by a resident's hauler. These will be composted. Bags of yard waste placed at curbside on days other than those designated for yard waste pick up will be comingled with trash. They will not be composted by the hauler.
- **Place recyclables in a large Toter or bin curbside. No plastic bags!** Bags can tangle in the sorting machine and cause damage. Items that do not fit in your Toter or curbside bin can be placed in paper bags and placed by the curb.

After a successful (small) tree giveaway trial last spring, the Willistown Environmental Sustainability Commission (ESC), in collaboration with the Chester County Conservation District (CCCD), is happy to announce that select species of trees and shrubs will be available to you on Saturday, October 26, at Greentree Park, on a limited basis through [TenMillionTrees.org](https://www.tenmilliontrees.org).

Trees and shrubs not only enhance your landscape, bolster property values, improve well-being, and beautify our neighborhoods, but they also provide essential ecosystem services such as shelter, food, stormwater management, erosion control, shade, and carbon dioxide sequestration. SINGLE HAULER SURVEY RESULTS

Thanks to all who completed the Trash/Recycling Survey this past spring!

We embarked upon a fact-finding endeavor to determine if there was sufficient interest among residents for the township to provide a single trash/recycling hauler. Having one contracted hauler would lower residents' quarterly bills, create less traffic/wear and tear on the roads, and allow the township to have greater leverage in demanding accountability and transparency.

After reviewing the survey results, the Willistown Environmental Sustainability Commission has decided not to recommend the single hauler initiative at this time. Instead, the Commission proposes updating the Willistown Township Code to the Board of Supervisors to enhance our enforcement capabilities and ensure alignment with state-wide regulations for trash, recycling, and yard waste collection.

The survey results were inconclusive, so the Commission plans to use the coming months to better educate residents about the potential benefits of a single hauler initiative through The Crier. Additionally, we will work on solidifying our relationships with current haulers operating in the township to ensure they meet the required standards for operating in Willistown Township. We hope to reintroduce the single hauler initiative at another time in the near future.

A HIGHLIGHT OF THE SURVEY RESULTS:

Demographics:

- 95% lived in a single-family home (475 respondents)
- 5% lived in an HOA or Apartment (24 respondents)
- 75.5% live in 2+ person households

Top 3 Current Service Providers:

- AJ Blosenski
- Opdenaker
- Whitetail Disposal

Overall rating of current service providers:

- 53.11% were "very satisfied," "satisfied" or "slightly satisfied"
- 8.02% were neutral
- 38.87% were "somewhat dissatisfied," "dissatisfied" or "very dissatisfied"

Most important factors when selecting a trash and recycling service:

- Consistent & timely collection - 59.72%
- Cost - 18.44%
- Service - 11.02%

Satisfaction with types of service received:

- **Trash**-54.76% said "very satisfied" or "satisfied," 16.63% said "neutral" and 28.39% were "very dissatisfied" or "dissatisfied."
- **Recycling**-46.6% said "very satisfied" or "satisfied," 14.43% said "neutral" and 38.56% were "very dissatisfied" or "dissatisfied"
- **Bulk trash**-34.56% said "very satisfied" or "satisfied," 28.05% said "neutral" and 14.45% were "very dissatisfied" or "dissatisfied." Almost 23% said they don't have this service.
- **Yard Waste**-28.57% said "very satisfied" or "satisfied," 27.45% said were "neutral" and 17.08% were "very dissatisfied" or "dissatisfied." Almost 27% said they don't have this service.

Residents in favor of Willistown switching to a single hauler for residential homes:

- Need more information to decide 43.49%
- Yes 37.68%
- No 15.23%

Here is an opportunity to dispose of sensitive documents that you've been storing but have been reluctant to dispose of as trash. Cancelled checks, new checks that you'll never use, insurance statements, tax forms, charge/bank/debit statements, receipts, savings passbooks, confidential letters, and brokerage statements are some of the many types of sensitive documents that people need to dispose of with finality in this age of identity theft. Shredding will take place on site in a specially equipped truck.

Limit: six boxes or paper bags preferred. Do not bring newspapers, magazines, cardboard, wallpaper, books, sheets of plastic, Pendaflex folders with metal strips, or three-ring binders. Remove all binder clips. Items containing staples, standard paper clips, or rubber bands will be accepted.

Drive-thru shredding event. Please place items in your trunk or bed of pick-up truck for ease of unloading. Shredding truck departs at 12:00PM or when it reaches its 5-ton capacity. **WILLISTOWN RESIDENTS ONLY.**

FALL STORMWATER TIPS

Seasonal Tips for Protecting Our Waterways

It is that time of year again, fall is here! Willistown Township would like to remind you of the importance of preventing stormwater pollution while you make the most of the fall season. Stormwater is formed when rainwater makes its way into storm drains or runs off our properties directly into streams. On its journey to the stream, stormwater can pick up harmful substances that pollute our watershed.

Stormwater runoff is often worsened by human activities, and can contain nitrogen and phosphorus pollutants from fertilizers, pet and yard waste. Because stormwater flows over hard surfaces directly into a water body or storm drain, there is no opportunity for soil and plants or a water treatment facility to filter out pollutants.

Keep pollutants out of our waterways by keeping these tips in mind:

- Sweep up grass clippings and fertilizer from driveways, sidewalks and streets, and rake, mulch or compost yard waste. Don't forget to sweep along the curb. Remove leaves from your gutters, ditches and driveways, sidewalks and streets.
- Fall is the best season to fertilize your lawn and control common weeds. Weed and feed responsibly. Use fertilizers and pesticides only as needed and always read and follow product instructions carefully. Be phosphorus conscious!
- Consider using alternative lawn-care techniques in addition to, or even instead of, pesticides. Try these: pulling weeds by hand (counts as a workout), or spot-treating weedy areas instead of your entire yard.
- Resist the urge to let Fido fend for himself when the weather turns colder and keep on scooping poop. Pet waste contains phosphorus, nitrogen and harmful bacteria.
- During routine fall tune-ups, check your car and lawn equipment for leaks. A good rainstorm can send gasoline and oil drips from automobiles, lawnmowers and power equipment into waterways.

A little extra caution while you keep up with your fall to-do list can make a big difference for the health of our watershed, and we thank you for helping with this effort. If you have any questions or concerns about stormwater management any time of year, call Willistown Township at 610-647-5300.
