

Willistown Recycling Committee Minutes for Meeting of June 10th, 2014

1. Covered Device Recycling Act (Federal)

Prohibits recycler from charging for collection. Willistown paid eForce a flat fee of \$2,500 to cover the cost of recycling CRTs. What gives? Tate will contact PADEP for clarification of the restriction on a vendor charging for any component of e-waste.

2. PA Resources Council (PRC)

This 75-year-old organization is located on Providence Road in Delaware County. Their mission is to protect the environment. This includes managing recycling programs for townships and other types of organizations/companies. Tate has been in contact with them recently and will definitely consider their services in 2015. Their end recycling vendor is eCovanta, a PADEP-approved recycler.

3. June 7th Document Shredding

“Business” was steady: 7,008 pounds of paper. Rapid Recycling, the vendor, said “That was a good day for us.”

4. Curbside Chipping

228,000 pounds!!!! All of the chips were delivered to Sugartown Strawberries, Bob Lange’s farm on Sugartown Road. As of late May, Bob indicated that anyone wishing to pick up some chips could do so. Obviously, there will not be a charge. Tip of the hat to the Public Works crew; Bill Hagan, Public Works Department Director; and Dave Burman, Township Manager, for initiating this program.

5. Videotape/Audiotape/CDs/DVDs Recycling

Since January 1, 2014, 700 pounds have been recycled.
