GO WilMa! stands for Get Outside 'round Willistown and Malvern! Our annual theme is

inspired by the National Collaborative Summer Reading program for K-teens. The 2018 summer reading theme is "Libraries Rock," and this year's GO WilMa! theme is "Kindness Rocks GO WilMa!"



Kids who sign up for the summer reading program at Malvern or Paoli Library receive a GO WilMa! Field Guide—a passport of sorts. The Guide includes scavenger hunt clues leading to hidden "Inspiration Stations" in our local landscape. Each Station ties music to the outdoors by honoring a band with animals

or geology in their name or a song about nature, etc. Kids and adults will have a ball listening to such bands as The Beatles, Howling Wolf, Phish, Seal, The Stray Cats, Flock of Seagulls, and more!

We are incorporating Kindness Rocks in this year's program. The cover article of this edition has more about The Kindness Rocks Project and the Willistown Parks & Recreation version of it. We hope our adventurers wrap up this season of GO WilMa! with many happy memories of music and spreading kindness in the great outdoors. Dispose of sensitive documents to protect yourself from identity theft!

Shredding will take place on site. Limit: six boxes. No newspapers, magazines, cardboard, wallpaper, books, plastic, photographs, folders with metal strips, three-ring binders, or binder clips. Items containing staples, standard paper clips, or rubber bands will be accepted.

The shredding truck will depart at 1 PM or when its five-ton capacity is reached. Come early. No commercial enterprises!



Prescription Disposal

Safely dispose your scripts at the Willistown PD

You will find drop boxes in the Willistown Police Building lobby, 688 Sugartown Road, Malvern, 8 AM to 3:30 PM, Monday through Friday, and the Paoli Hospital Main Entrance lobby, the valet entrance, 255 West Lancaster Avenue, Paoli, 7 AM–9 PM, 7 days a week. No questions asked, no forms to complete, just drop your items in the specially sealed blue boxes and away you go!

Medicines that are allowed to languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. They are also dangerous for our environment—when they are thrown in the trash or flushed they end up in our waterways and drinking water.

If you no longer have a need for a certain drug, get rid of it. The blue boxes can accommodate expired, unused, and unwanted prescription and over-the-counter drugs including pills, capsules, tablets, patches, liquids, creams, and powders in their original manufacturer or pharmacy prescription containers.

Lids and caps should be securely affixed. You may remove labels from pharmacy prescription containers; however, it isn't necessary. You will be dropping your drugs in a safe and secure metal box the contents of which will be incinerated.



CAUTION!

The usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—pose potential safety and health hazards!

NOT ACCEPTED

Needles, sharps, IV solutions, or illicit substances such as cocaine, heroin, and marijuana can not be accepted.

Those Pesky Plastic Bags...but Wait!

Paper or Plastic?

What is the better choice, a paper or plastic bag? A reusable bag of course is the best choice. However...

You'd be surprised to know:

A few years ago, some California communities banned plastic shopping bags only to find out that the sale of plastic garbage bags and wastebasket liners went up. They discovered that many people use the free plastic bags for kitchen and bathroom trash collection and diaper and pet waste disposal. As a result, the plastic bag bans in California were lifted.

What you need to know:

Chester County grocery stores have collection containers at their entrances for recycling plastic bags. Some bags might rip or have a hole in the bottom, making them unusable for home trash collection or other uses—please don't throw them out. The grocery store recycling container is the place for them as well as other plastic items.

Other plastic items are recyclable too:

You can recycle plastic newspaper sleeves, dry cleaning bags, bread bags, product wrap (used on paper towels, diapers, bathroom tissue, and on water bottles), food storage bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, LDPE/HDPE films and any film packaging or bag that has the How2Recycle label shown. Please recycle only CLEAN and DRY bags and film and remove receipts, produce weight stickers, or any other items.



Never mix plastic bags in with other recycling!

Placing plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin is a no-no! A plastic bag can jam expensive sorting equipment at a recycling facility.

What happens to the bags?

Clean plastic bags mixed with sawdust will become plastic lumber: a deck, a dock, a fence, a bench or even an attractive outdoor recycling container.

Please remember that Willistown Township is a state-mandated recycling community, meaning its residents are required to recycle!

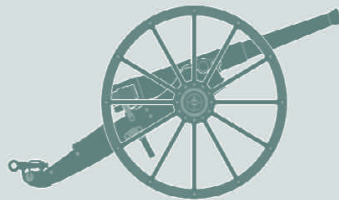

Spring Migration Bird Banding

Tuesdays & Thursdays
April 12–May 24 • Sunup–11 AM

Who is thriving in our conserved open space? Meet Willistown's most colorful inhabitants up close! Our spring migration bird banding program runs weekly at Rushton Woods Preserve if it is not raining and it is above 40 degrees. Our federally registered banders gently capture the birds in mist nets and weigh, measure, and examine each bird before gently releasing them. Data is submitted to a national bird conservation database. To see the most birds, arrive no later than 8 AM. Action is often constant until about 11 AM, after which the nets are closed.
