INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

1. BIDDER'S RESPONSIBILITY

Each bidder shall familiarize themselves with all of the attached forms, Instructions, General Conditions, Specifications, Maps, et cetera, as bidder will be held responsible to fully comply therewith. Each bidder must visit the work sites prior to bidding and acquaint themselves with conditions affecting the work. Each bidder must initial each map exhibit attached hereto and submit each initialed map exhibit with the bid proposal. The map exhibits attached hereto as Appendix "A" contain approximate representations of the areas to be maintained.

2. DELIVERY OF PROPOSALS

It is the responsibility of the bidders to deliver their bids prior to the time of opening regardless of what medium they use to deliver it. No bid shall be considered if it arrives after the time set for the bid opening. Envelopes containing bids are to be delivered to:

3. BULLETINS (ADDENDUM)

Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of all bulletins which have been issued during period of bidding and agree that said bulletins shall become part of this Contract.

4. PROPOSAL GUARANTY

Each Proposal shall be accompanied by either a certified check or Surety Company's Bid Bond as specified herein under "ADVERTISEMENT", in an amount of not less than ten percent (10%) of the base bid, which check or bond shall be payable to the Township and shall be forfeited as liquidated damages if the bidder fails to execute the Contract in conformity with the Agreement incorporated in the Contract Documents, and furnish bonds as specified, within ten (10) business days after receipt of Contract Documents. Such checks or bid bonds will be returned to all except the three lowest bidders immediately after the award, and the remaining unsuccessful bidders checks or bid bonds will be returned when the Contracts executed by both parties are delivered to the successful bidder.

5. METHOD FOR SUBMITTING BIDS

No proposal will be considered unless submitted upon the proposal form for the project. The blank spaces in the proposal form shall be filled in correctly, where indicated, for each and every item for which a description is given, and the bidder must state the prices in ink. Bidders must visit every property and verify conditions in the field **and attend one pre-bid walk at a representative location to be determined by Township. The mandatory pre-bid walk will take place on 2/25/26 at 10:00 am. Please meet at Okehocking Preserve 5316 West Chester Pike, Newtown Square PA, 19073. 6. CHANGES WHILE BIDDING

During the bidding period, bidders may be furnished addenda or bulletins for additions to or alterations of the plans or specifications, if any, which shall be included in the work, covered by the Proposal and become a part of the Contract Documents.

If any prospective bidder on the proposed Contract has questions concerning the meaning of any part of the plans, specifications, or other proposed Contract Documents, they may submit to the Parks and Preserve Steward or Director of Public Works a written request for an interpretation thereof. The bidder submitting the request will be responsible for the prompt delivery of the written request.

Any interpretation of the proposed documents will be made only by an addendum duly issued and a copy of such addendum will be mailed or delivered to each prospective bidder who has received a set of such documents. The Parks and Preserves Steward or Director of Public Works and/or Township will not be responsible for any other explanations or interpretations of the proposed documents.

7. BID OPENING PROCEDURE

Sealed proposals on projects will be received by the Township at the designated place, until the time stated in the "Advertisement" at which time all proposals will be publicly opened and read. The Township reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or parts thereof, as it may deem best for the interest of the Township.

8. COLLUSIVE BIDS

The proposal of any bidder or bidders who engage in collusive bidding shall be rejected. Any bidder who submits more than one proposal in such manner as to make it appear that the proposals submitted are on a competitive basis from different parties shall be considered a collusive bidder. The Township may reject the bid proposals of any collusive bidder upon bid opening, or thereafter.

9. WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

No bidder may withdraw their bid unless the request is made in writing and is received by the Township prior to the time set for bid opening. After bid opening, no bidder may withdraw his bid prior to the Township taking action on the bids. Requests for withdrawal of bids after bid opening due to clerical error shall be made in accordance with Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Act No. 4 (S.B. 793).

10. AWARDING OF CONTRACT

The Township will award the contract to the lowest responsible Bidder whose qualifications demonstrate that the award will be in the best interest of the Township and whose proposal complies with all prescribed requirements. No award will be made until the Township has concluded such investigations as it deems necessary to establish the responsibilities, qualifications, and financial ability of the Bidder to complete the project in accordance with the Contract Documents.

The Township reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

11. EXECUTION OF CONTRACT

The individual, firm or corporation to whom or to which the Contract has been awarded within ten (10) days after receipt of said documents shall sign and return to the Township the Contract Documents and substitute for the certified check, or bid bond, which accompanied the proposal, a Performance Bond or bonds in the penal sum at least equal to the amount of such Contract for the faithful performance of the Contract, and also an additional bond for labor and materials in the penal sum at least equal to the amount of such Contract to cover the prompt payment in full for all materials furnished and labor supplied or performed, executed by a surety company or companies qualified to do business in the state.

No proposals or awards shall be considered binding upon the Township unless and until the Contract Documents are properly executed by both parties.

12. FAILURE TO EXECUTE CONTRACT

If the lowest responsible bidder to whom the Contract is awarded fails to submit bonds or execute the Contract within the time specified, the amount of the proposal guaranty shall be paid to the Township as liquidated damages. In such case the Township, at its discretion, may award the Contract to the next lowest responsible bidder, or reject all bids.

13. SUBLETTING OR ASSIGNING OF CONTRACT

The Contractor shall not sublet, sell, transfer, assign, or otherwise dispose of the Contract, or any portion thereof, of his right, title or interest therein without the written consent of the Township.

14. REJECTION OF PROPOSALS

The right is reserved by the Township at its discretion to reject any or all bids or parts thereof. Proposals may be rejected if they show any omission, alterations of form, addition or deductions not called for, conditional or uninvited alternate bids, or irregularities of any kind. However, the Township reserves the right to waive any defects or irregularities on proposals.

15. OPTIONS

All bidders must bid all items of this Contract. It is the Township's intent to award one Contract, but the Township reserves the right to delete any items or components it deems necessary or appropriate.

16. BID ITEMS

The contract is to be bid by unit prices. The bid is to be based on the total quantity of each item. The unit price is to be multiplied by quantity of each individual item.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. DEFINITIONS

The TOWNSHIP is Willistown Township, as referred to in the Advertisement and whenever the word Owner is used herein it shall refer to and designate the Township of the first part of the Contract contained herein.

The CONTRACTOR is the individual, group, partnership, or corporation undertaking to do the work herein specified (including his or their heirs, legal representatives, successors or assigns) and is the party of second part of the Contract contained herein. The PARKS and PRESERVES STEWARD and the TOWNSHIP DIRECTOR of PUBLIC WORKS, shall be the appointed representatives of the Owner, shall be the Inspectors who will perform surveillance on the execution of the Contract contained herein, and shall direct and approve additional work or change orders throughout the contract period as expressed in writing to the Contractor.

The PROPERTY is all areas described in those maps attached hereto as "Appendix A".

The CONTRACT DOCUMENTS consist of the Advertisement, Instructions to Bidders, Form of Proposal, General and Special Conditions, Contract Specifications, Form of Agreement, Form of Bond, List of Contract Drawings, Standard Details, etc.

A SUBCONTRACT is an individual group, partnership, or corporation having a direct Contract with the Contractor to furnish a special service, labor, or material towards the completion of the Contractors Contract.

An INSPECTOR is an authorized representative of the Owner assigned to inspect the work performed and the materials and equipment supplied by the Contractor as to compliance with the Contract Documents. Inspectors include, but is not limited to, the Parks and Preserves Steward and/or the Director of Public Works.

The term WORK, used herein, includes all labor and/or materials, equipment and any other facilities necessary for the Contractor to complete the Contract.

The term APPROVED, used herein, shall be held to mean as approved by Willistown Township.

NOTICE shall be deemed to have been duly served if written and delivered in person to the individual, or to a member of the firm, or to an officer of the Corporation for whom it is intended, or if delivered at or sent by registered mail to the last business address known to those who give notice.

2. SUBCONTRACTS

No part of the Contract shall be sublet without the prior written approval of the Owner and setting forth of

requirements to be met.

SUPERINTENDENCE BY CONTRACTOR

At all times during which work is being performed under or related to this Contract, the Contractor shall keep a competent superintendent, acceptable to the Owner, constantly on the site, from the commencement of work under this Contract until the completion thereof, who shall be familiar and up to date with the Work and all related Contracts affected thereby. The superintendent shall, in the absence of the Contractor, see that the instructions of the Owner are carried out and all directions given such superintendent shall be as binding as if given to the Contractor.

3. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW

Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and the Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included herein; and, if through mistake or otherwise, any such provision is not inserted or is not correctly inserted, then upon the application of either party the Contract shall forthwith be physically amended to make such insertion.

4. PROTECTION OF WORK AND PROPERTY

The Contractor shall provide adequate protection of the Property, all property of the Owner, and all Work performed hereunder, against injury or loss arising in connection with this Contract. Contractor shall repair any and all such damage, injury or loss and restore the damaged, injured, or affected portion thereof to its original condition, except such as may be due directly to errors caused by agents or employees of the Owner. Contractor shall adequately protect all properties adjacent to the Property, as provided by law and the specifications and drawings.

The Contractor shall preserve and protect all trees, shrubs, and grass on or adjacent to the Property which do not reasonably interfere with the execution of the contract as may be determined by the Owner. Contractor shall be responsible for all unauthorized cutting or damaging of trees, shrubs, and grass areas including but not limited to damage due to careless operation of equipment, equipment access, and stockpiling of materials.

5. TEMPORARY PROVISION FOR PUBLIC TRAVEL

The Contractor shall perform the Work in such a manner as to interfere as little as possible with the use of intersecting roads or adjoining property. No obstruction will be allowed to remain longer than is absolutely necessary, and the Contractor shall provide all safe guards and temporary passageways that may be necessary for the convenience and protection of all persons using said property either day or night.

6. TERMINATION; DELAYS; LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

If the Contractor refuses or fails to perform the work with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in these Contract Documents, or as modified as provided in these Contract Documents, the Owner, by written notice to the Contractor, may terminate the Contractor's right to proceed with the work. Upon such termination, the Owner may take over the work and perform the same to completion by Contract or otherwise, and the Contractor and his sureties shall be liable to the Owner for additional cost incurred by the Owner for liquidated damages for any delay in the completion of the

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The Owner may require the Contractor to dismiss from the work such employee or employees as the Owner or the Director may deem incompetent, careless, or insubordinate.

10. THE OWNER'S RIGHT TO DO WORK

If the Contractor should neglect to perform the work properly or fail to perform any provision of the Contract, the Owner, after three (3) days' written notice to the Contractor may, without prejudice to any other remedy he may have, make good such deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the payment then or thereafter due the Contractor or require the Contractor to perform the work again at no cost to the Owner.

11. THE OWNER'S RIGHT TO TERMINATE CONTRACT

If the Contractor should be adjudged bankrupt, or if Contractor should make a general assignment for the benefit of his creditors, or if a receiver should be appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency, or if Contractor should persistently or repeatedly refuse or should fail, except in cases for which extension of time is provided, to supply enough properly skilled workmen or proper materials, or if Contractor should fail to make prompt payment to subcontractors or for material or labor, or persistently disregard laws, ordinances or the instructions of Township representatives, or otherwise be guilty of a substantial violation of any provision of the Contract, then the Owner, upon finding sufficient cause exists to justify such action may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy and after giving the Contractor, and Contractor's surety, if any, seven (7) days' written notice, terminate the Contract and take possession of the premises and of all materials, tools and appliances thereon and finish the Work by whatever method Owner may reasonably deem expedient. In such case the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the Work is finished. If the unpaid balance of the Contract sum shall exceed the expense of finishing the Work, including compensation for additional managerial and administrative services, such remaining excess shall be paid to the Contractor. If expense of finishing the Work exceeds such unpaid balance, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the Owner. The expense incurred by the Owner as herein provided, and the damage incurred through the Contractor's default, shall be calculated and certified by the Township's Director of Public Works.

12. DAMAGES

Should either party to the Contract suffer damages because of any wrongful act or neglect of the other party or an employee or agent of either, a claim shall be made in writing to the party liable within a reasonable time from the first observance of such damage and not later than the final payment, except as expressly stipulated otherwise in the case of faulty work or materials.

13. DIRECTOR STATUS

The Township Director of Public Works and the Township Parks and Preserves Steward shall be the Owner's representatives during the contract period related to their respective areas of oversight. The Township Parks and Preserves Steward shall be the Owner's representative for matters concerning Township parks and preserves, and the Township Director of Public Works shall be the Owner's representative for matters concerning all other Township-owned properties and sewer-related matters and infrastructure. Either the Township Director of Public Works or the Township Parks and Preserves Steward will make periodic visits to determine if the progress and quality of the is proceeding and being

performed in accordance with the Contract. The Owner's representatives will not be required to make exhaustive or continuous on-site inspections to check the quality or quantity of the work and they are not responsible for the Contractor's failure to execute work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

During such visits and on the basis of their observation while at the site, the Owner's representatives shall have authority to reject the work whenever such rejection may be necessary in their reasonable opinion to ensure the proper execution of the Contract.

14. SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS

The Contractor shall comply with the Department of Labor Safety and Health Regulations for construction promulgated under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (PL-91-596) and under Section 107 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (PL-91-54). All work must be in compliance with State and Federal Occupational Health and Safety Regulations.

The safety and health of park and preserve users is a crucial component of this agreement. The Contractor will provide up to date Pennsylvania Child Abuse Clearance forms for each of its employees who will be present at the Owners properties during the agreement period. Clearances shall be maintained and made available to the Owner within five (5) business days of the Owner's request for the duration of the agreement.

15. INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor will indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and their officers, agents, elected and appointed officials, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Work, that is caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of the Contractor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

These Special Conditions shall apply to the work as a whole, and to each and all branches or subdivisions and Contractors for same should the work be divided. Subcontractors should be supplied with a copy of these Special Conditions and no Contract or arrangements with them shall be such as to conflict herewith.

1. CONTRACT SECURITY

After the Contract award on March 4, 2026, the Contractor shall have ten (10) business days to furnish two (2) Bonds, with Surety, acceptable to the Township as follows:

One in the full amount of the Contract conditioned for the faithful performance of said Contract including the indemnification of the Township in all respects set forth in the General Conditions and Specifications.

And the other for the full amount of the Contract conditioned to pay for all labor and materials which may be furnished to fulfill the Contract.

To each Bond shall be attached a recent financial statement of the Surety, along with a Power of Attorney

showing that the person signing the Bonds on behalf of the Surety has power so to do. Should any surety upon the bonds for the performance of the Contract and payment for materials and labor become unsatisfactory to the Township, the Contractor shall promptly furnish such additional security as may be required from time to time to protect the interest of the Township and of persons supplying materials and labor in the performance of the work required by the Contract.

Only bonds from companies licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will be considered acceptable.

Work shall not commence under this contract until each of the above bonds have been obtained and provided to Owner in a form satisfactory to the Township.

2. CONTRACTOR'S INSURANCE

At the time of Contract execution, Contractor shall accept, insofar as the work covered by the Contract is concerned, the provisions of the Pennsylvania Worker's Compensation Act, as amended, and shall furnish the Township with a Certificate of Insurance covering the contractor's liability under the Pennsylvania Worker's Compensation Act, as amended. In addition, contractor shall carry liability, property damage, and vehicle insurance as stated in the following paragraphs, and the Certificate of Insurance shall name the Township, its officers, agents, appointed and elected officials, and employees as additional insured parties. Coverage shall remain in effect for the entire duration of the Contract.

The Contractor shall not commence work under this Contract until Contractor has obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and provided such insurance to the Owner in a form satisfactory to the Owner, nor shall the Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on the Contract or any related subcontract until all similar insurance required of the subcontractor has been so obtained and approved.

The Contractor shall either: require each Subcontractor to procure and maintain during the life of the Subcontract, insurance of the type and in the same amounts as specified; or, insure the activities of the subcontractors in the contractor's own policy.

A written 30 Day Notice of Cancellation or Non-renewal must be provided to the Township and be so indicated on the Certificates of Insurance for all policies.

One (1) original copy of all Certificates must be provided to the Township.

Umbrella policies shall spell out the primary coverage to which the excess coverage will apply.

Only certificates of insurance from companies licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will be approved.

All contractor/subcontractors are required to procure and maintain the following insurance coverage:

(a) Worker's Compensation Insurance

The contractor/subcontractor must maintain during the life of the contract Workers' Compensation insurance for their employees. Coverage must be in accordance with statutory requirements.

(b) Public Liability

The contractor/subcontractor must maintain during the life of this contract Public Liability insurance to protect themselves, their subcontractors, and the Owner for injury or damage caused directly or indirectly by themselves or their employees.

(c) Vehicles

The contractor/subcontractor must maintain during the life of this contract Liability Insurance for all vehicles operating on Township property.

(d) Insurance Coverage Requirements

The Certificate of Insurance must also name Willistown Township as an additional insured party. The Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until they have obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and the Township has approved such insurance, nor shall the Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on their subcontract until all similar insurance required of the subcontractor has been so obtained and approved.

3. INSPECTION OF WORK

The Owner and/or its representatives may appoint such persons as they deem necessary, to inspect and/or oversee at any time, materials and equipment furnished and work done under this contract.

4. CONTRACT STANDARDS ACT

The following stipulations are hereby included in the Contract subject to the Contract Work Hours Standards Act:

(a) Overtime Requirements. No Contractor or Subcontractor contracting for any part of the Contract work shall require or permit any laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, to be employed on such work in excess of eight (8) hours in any calendar day or in excess of forty (40) hours in any work week unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate of not less than one and one-half times his basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any calendar day or in excess of forty (40) hours in such workweek, whichever is the greater number of overtime hours.

(b) Violations: Liability for Unpaid Wages: Liquidated Damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (a) the Contractor and any Subcontractor responsible therefore shall be liable to any affected employee for unpaid wages. In addition, such Contractor or Subcontractor shall be liable to the United States for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed, with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic employed in violation of clause (a), in the sum of \$10 for each calendar day on which such employee was required or permitted to work in excess of eight (8) hours or in excess of forty (40) hours in a workweek without payment of the overtime wages required by clause (a).

(c) Withholding for Unpaid Wages and Liquidated Damages. The Township may withhold from any monies payable on account of work performed by the Contractor or Subcontractor the full amount of wages required by the Contract and such sums as may administratively be determined to be necessary to satisfy and liabilities of such Contractor or Subcontractor for liquidated damages as provided in clause (b).

(d) Insertion of Clauses in Subcontracts The Contractor agrees to insert the foregoing clauses (a), (b), (c), and this clause (d) in all Subcontracts.

5. ACT 287

The Contractor must comply with Act 287 of 1974 enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania which specifies the Contractor's responsibilities during excavation and demolition operations in areas of underground utilities.

6. SUSPENSION OF WORK DUE TO UNFAVORABLE CONDITIONS

If, in the judgment of the Township, the Contractor is taking undue risk of damage to any part of the project or property by proceeding with the work during unfavorable weather or other conditions, the Owner shall immediately verbally notify the Contractor or his representative on the site that work is being suspended or canceled. Once it has been determined by the Township that conditions are suitable for work to resume the contractor may then proceed. In the case of such suspension, no allowance will be made to the Contractor for any expense resulting there from, and the contractor will not charge the Township for any suspended or canceled work.

7. SUSPENSION OF WORK DUE TO FAULT OF CONTRACTOR

Should the Contractor fail to comply with any order of the Township relative to any particular part of the work, the Owner shall have the right to suspend the work on any or all parts until his orders respecting the particular parts are complied with. In case of such suspension, which shall be considered due to the fault of the Contractor, it shall be at the expense of the Contractor on account of idle equipment or forces during the terms of such suspension.

8. SUSPENSION OF WORK DUE TO UNFORESEEN CAUSES

If the Contractor shall be delayed in the completion of his work by reason of unforeseeable causes beyond his control and without his fault or knowledge; such as acts of God or of a public enemy, fire, flood, epidemic, quarantine, restriction, strike, riot, civil commotion, or freight embargo the Contractor will not be liable for any expenses due to the suspension of the contract.

9. TIME LIMITS OF WORK

Work shall be performed between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. each weekday; weekend work shall be approved in advance by Municipality.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

The contractor agrees to perform the following work:

A. **Mowing:** All identified Township lands are to be mown as directed below. in addition to the following requirements:

*Note: The Township Representatives may cancel any mowing because of the lack of rainfall or other environmental constraints, or other reasons such as but not limited to, a change in trail layout or land management objectives, by providing verbal notice to the contractor. In all circumstances, Contractor must removal **all trash, debris, refuse, limbs, and sticks prior to mowing.***

1. **Trimming/Weed Eating:** The Contractor shall hand trim the grass around curbs, trees, tree cages, bushes, planting beds, utility poles, sign posts, fences, sidewalks, walkways, Township event yard signs, areas where mowers are not able to fit, hills, or embankments than are not able to be mowed and any other objects as required to provide a uniform appearance. **The trimming must be completed on the same day as the mowing.**
2. **Litter and Debris:** It is the Contractor's responsibility to maintain the area in a neat and attractive condition. Litter and debris must be collected and removed prior to each mowing. When finished mowing, the contractor will blow to remove any grass clippings from sidewalks, walkways, roadways, and parking areas. Debris such as fallen trees, branches, sticks and limbs are to be removed by Contractor unless said trees, branches, sticks or limbs are of a certain size where chainsaws (or other substantial pieces of equipment) are necessary to remove or dispose of them. Where chainsaws or other similar pieces of equipment or required for removal or disposal, Contractor must contact the Township Director of Public Works for Township coordination of and assistance with removal and disposal.

B. **Ball Field Miscellaneous:** Rita Reves park backstops and fence lines shall be trimmed every time the grass is mowed. Infield areas, bleachers, bench areas, and gravel areas shall be kept free of weeds and grass growth.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS, INVOICING, AND LOCATIONS

The work areas listed below are separated into three categories: Parks Properties, Township Properties, and Sewer Properties. See Attachment A: Maps for details. A separate invoice should be submitted for each of the three categories, with each category being further defined in the following tables.

Mowing schedule and timing:

- Mowing will begin mid-April and will continue through October. Exact first and last cut dates will be determined by weather and plant growth. The Township will issue a Notice to Proceed via email when work should begin.
- Sites requiring 28 cuts will be mowed weekly
- Sites requiring 14 cuts will be mowed bi-weekly

- Mow to height of 1 ½ - 3” unless otherwise specified
- Trail mowing width: 8’ unless otherwise specified
- Road Edge mowing width: 6’ unless otherwise specified

1. The Contractor and the Surety, jointly and severally, bind themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to the Owner for the performance of the Construction Contract, which is incorporated herein by reference.
2. If the Contractor performs the Construction Contract, the Surety and the Contractor shall have no obligation under this Bond, except to participate in conferences as provided in Subparagraph 3.1.
3. If there is no Owner Default, the Surety's obligation under this Bond shall arise after:
 - 3.1. The Owner has notified the Contractor and the Surety at its address described in Paragraph 10 below, that the Owner is considering declaring a Contractor Default and has requested and attempted to arrange a conference with the Contractor and the Surety to be held not later than fifteen days after receipt of such notice to discuss methods of performing the Construction Contract. If the Owner, the Contractor and the Surety agree, the Contractor shall be allowed a reasonable time to perform the Construction Contract, but such an agreement shall not waive the OWNER's right, if any, subsequently to declare a Contractor Default; and
 - 3.2. The Owner has declared a Contractor Default and formally terminated the Contractor's right to complete the contract. Such Contractor Default shall not be declared earlier than twenty days after the Contractor and the Surety have received notice as provided in Subparagraph 3.1; and
 - 3.3. The Owner has agreed to pay the Balance of the Contract Price to the Surety in accordance with the terms of the Construction Contract or to a contractor selected to perform the Construction Contract in accordance with the terms of the contract with the Owner.
4. When the Owner has satisfied the conditions of Paragraph 3, the Surety shall promptly and at the Surety's expense take one of the following actions:
 - 4.1. Arrange for the Contractor, with consent of the Owner, to perform and complete the Construction Contract; or
 - 4.2. Undertake to perform and complete the Construction Contract itself, through its agents or through independent contractors; or
 - 4.3. Obtain bids or negotiated proposals from qualified contractors acceptable to the Owner for a contract for performance and completion of the Construction Contract, arrange for a contract to be prepared for execution by the Owner and the contractor selected with the OWNER's concurrence, to be secured with performance and payment bonds executed by a qualified surety equivalent to the

- 4.4. Waive its right to perform and complete, arrange for completion, or obtain a new contractor and with reasonable promptness under the circumstances:
 - 4.4.1. After investigation, determine the amount for which it may be liable to the Owner and, as soon as practicable after the amount is determined, tender payment therefore to the Owner; or
 - 4.4.2. Deny liability in whole or in part and notify the Owner citing reasons therefore.

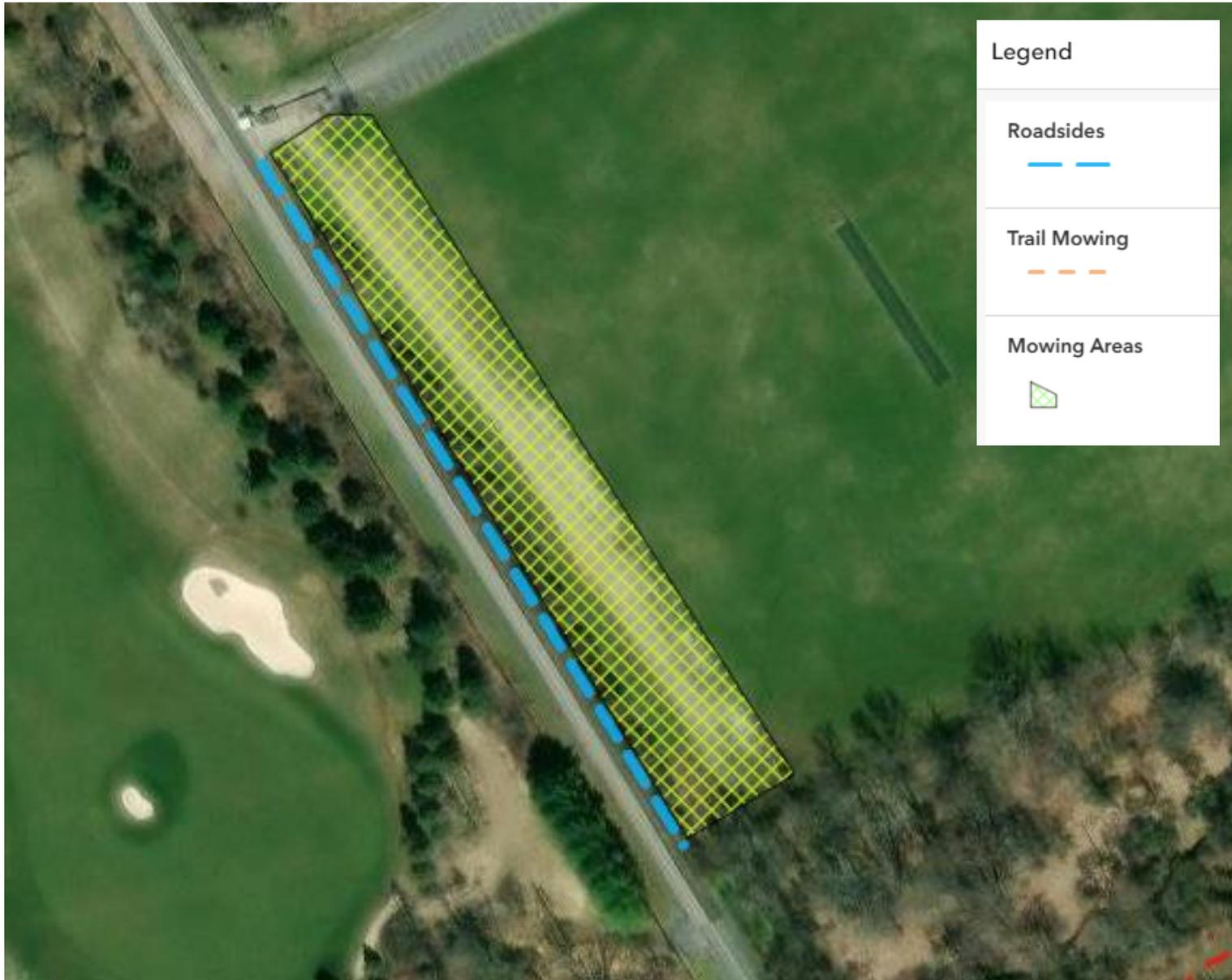

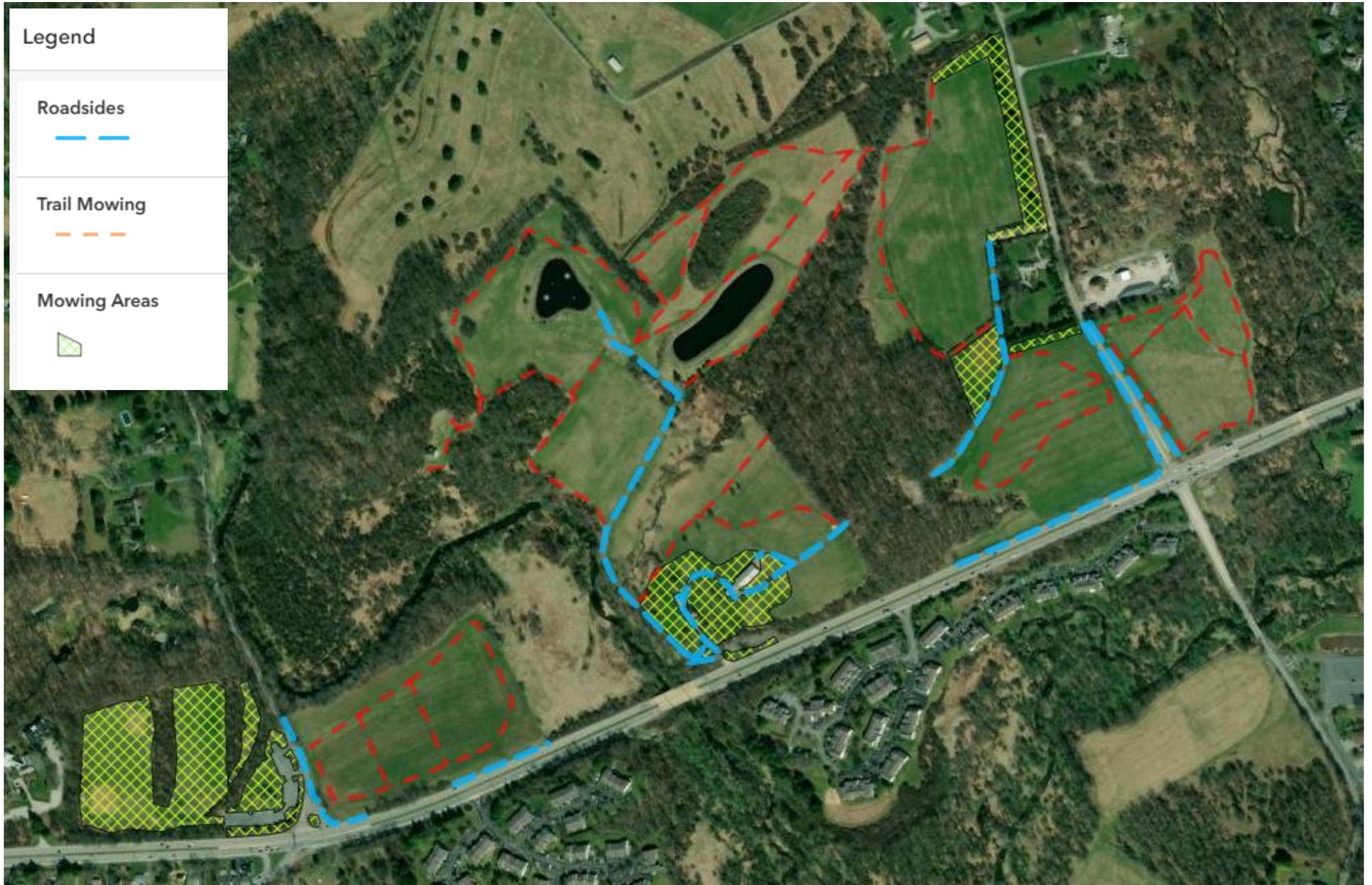

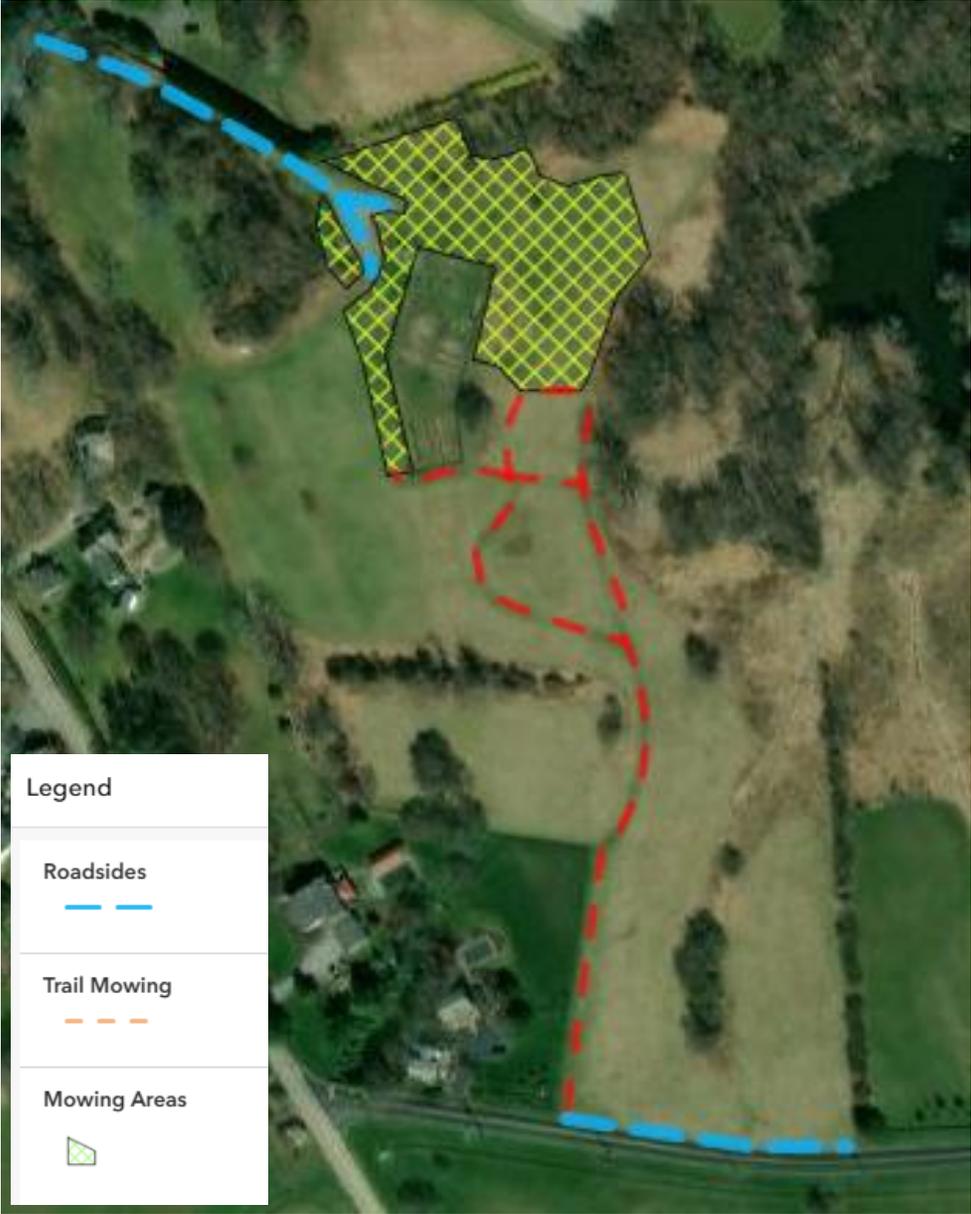

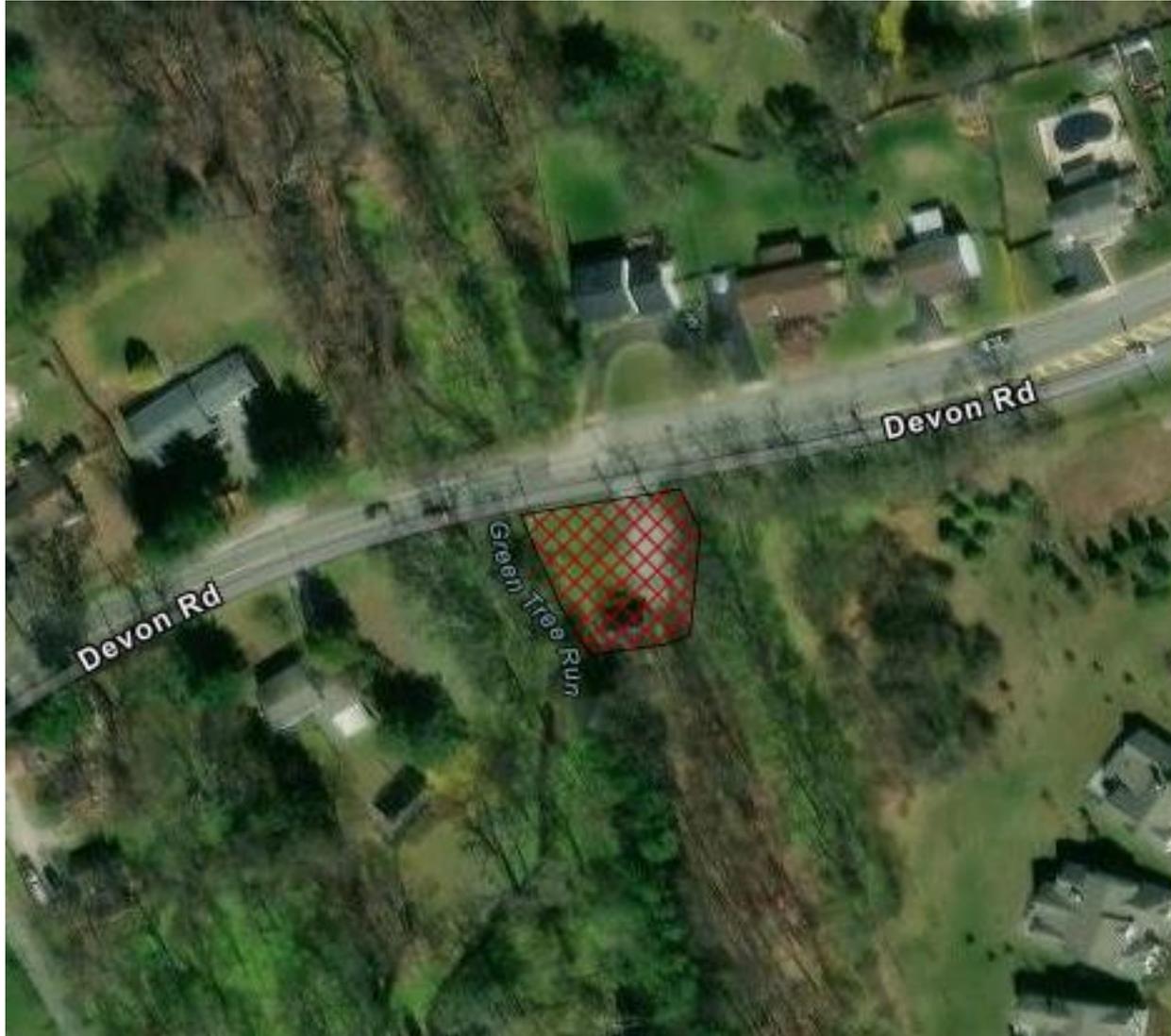

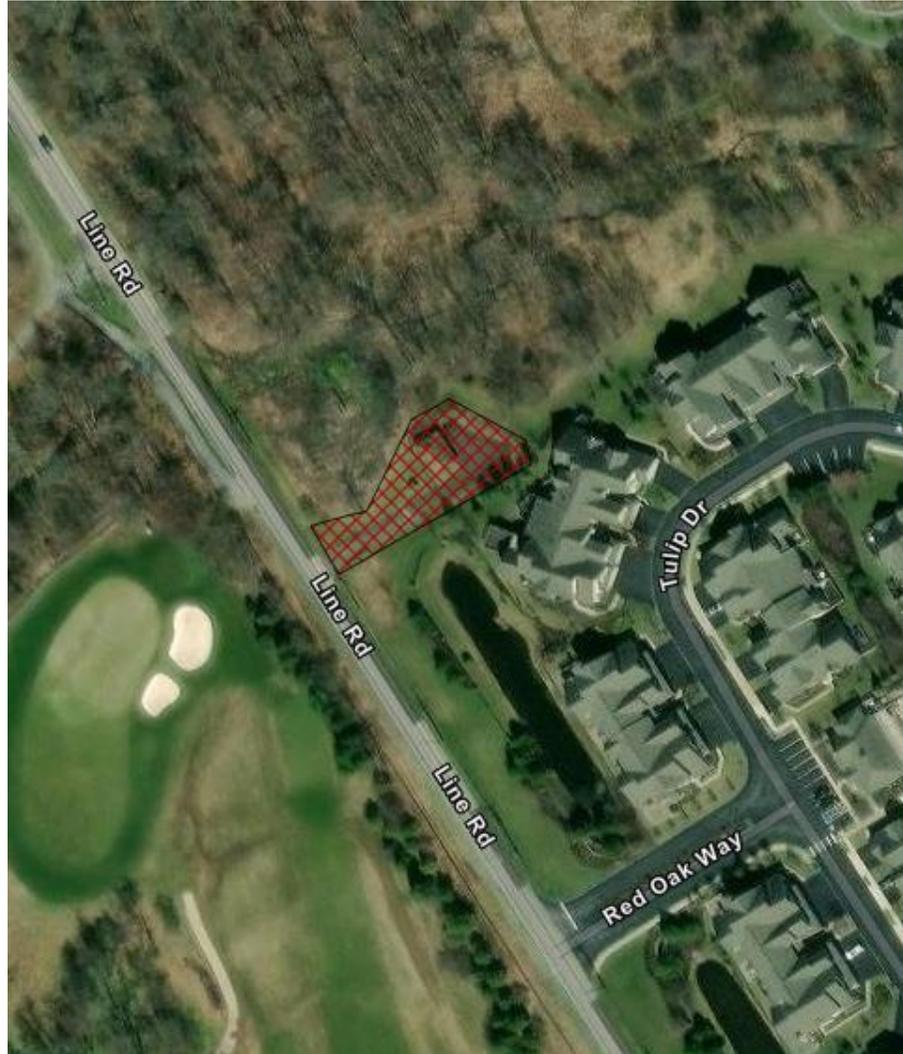

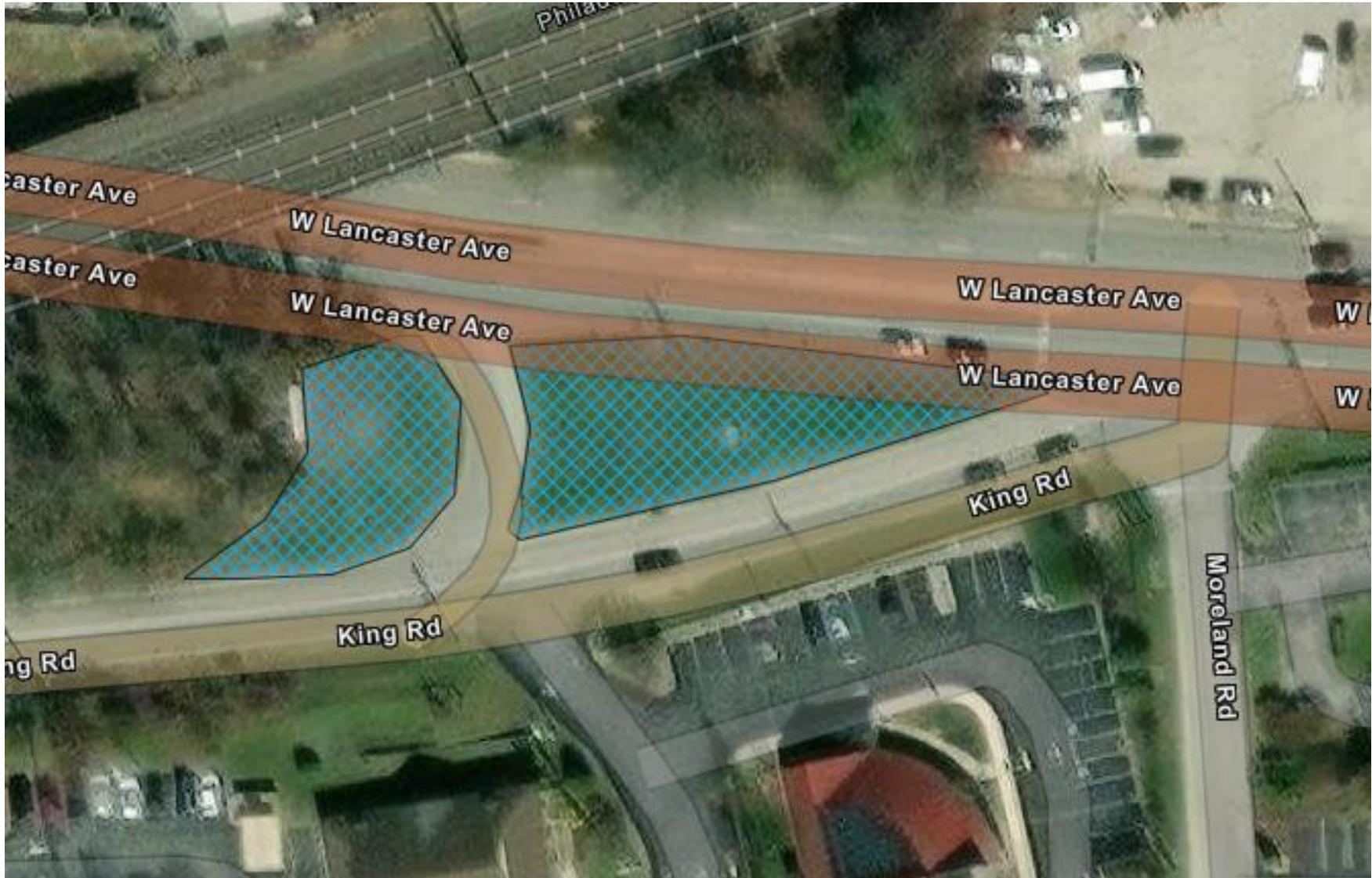

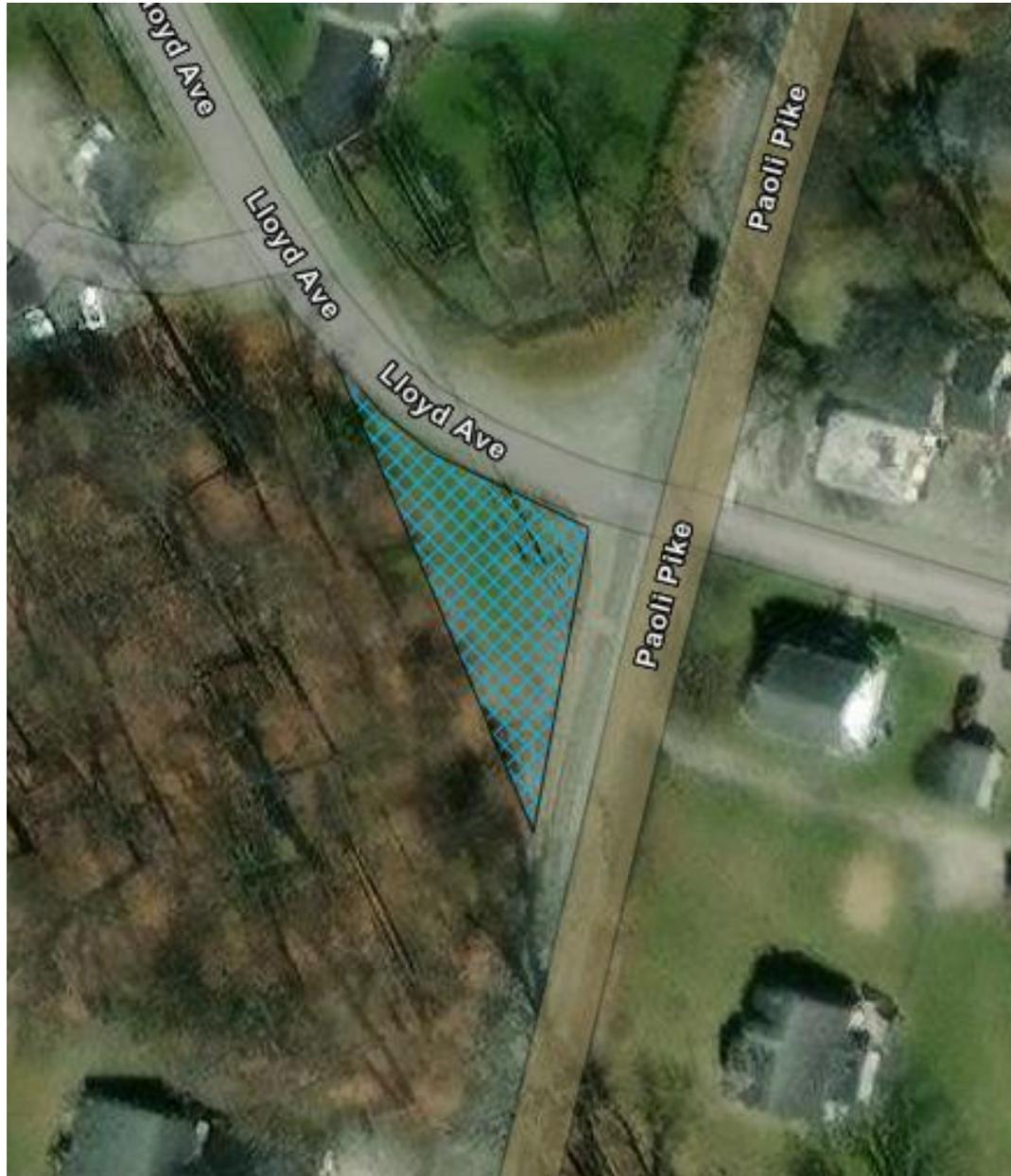
